AN ACT

- Amending the act of April 6, 1951 (P.L.69, No.20), entitled "An 1 act relating to the rights, obligations and liabilities of 2 landlord and tenant and of parties dealing with them and 3 amending, revising, changing and consolidating the law relating thereto," in tenement buildings and multiple dwelling premises, providing for lead testing requirements. 5 6 7 The General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania 8 hereby enacts as follows: 9 Section 1. The act of April 6, 1951 (P.L.69, No.20), known 10 as The Landlord and Tenant Act of 1951, is amended by adding a 11 subsection to read: 12 Section 506-A. Lead Testing Requirements. -- Notwithstanding 13 the Residential Lead-Based Paint Hazard Reduction Act of 1992 (Public Law 102-550, 42 U.S.C. § 4851 et seq.) or any other law 14 15 to the contrary:
- 16 (1) A lead test must be conducted for the following
- 17 properties built prior to 1978:
- (i) each dwelling unit in tenement buildings;
- 19 (ii) each dwelling in multiple dwelling premises;

- 1 (iii) apartments; or
- 2 (iv) residential properties that are leased or rented.
- 3 (2) The landlord of a property under paragraph (1) must
- 4 provide the results of the lead test and the date of the lead
- 5 test to any prospective tenant prior to a tenant entering into a
- 6 <u>lease or rental contract for the property.</u>
- 7 (3) The lead test shall be conducted by an inspector
- 8 <u>certified by the Department of Labor and Industry or a housing</u>
- 9 <u>inspector approved by the municipality, borough or township</u>
- 10 where the property is located.
- 11 (4) The lead test required under this section must be
- 12 conducted at least once and shall be submitted to the
- 13 municipality, borough or township in which the property is
- 14 located. The municipality, borough or township shall maintain a
- 15 list of all lead test results submitted, which shall be
- 16 <u>available to the public.</u>
- 17 Section 2. This act shall take effect in 60 days.
